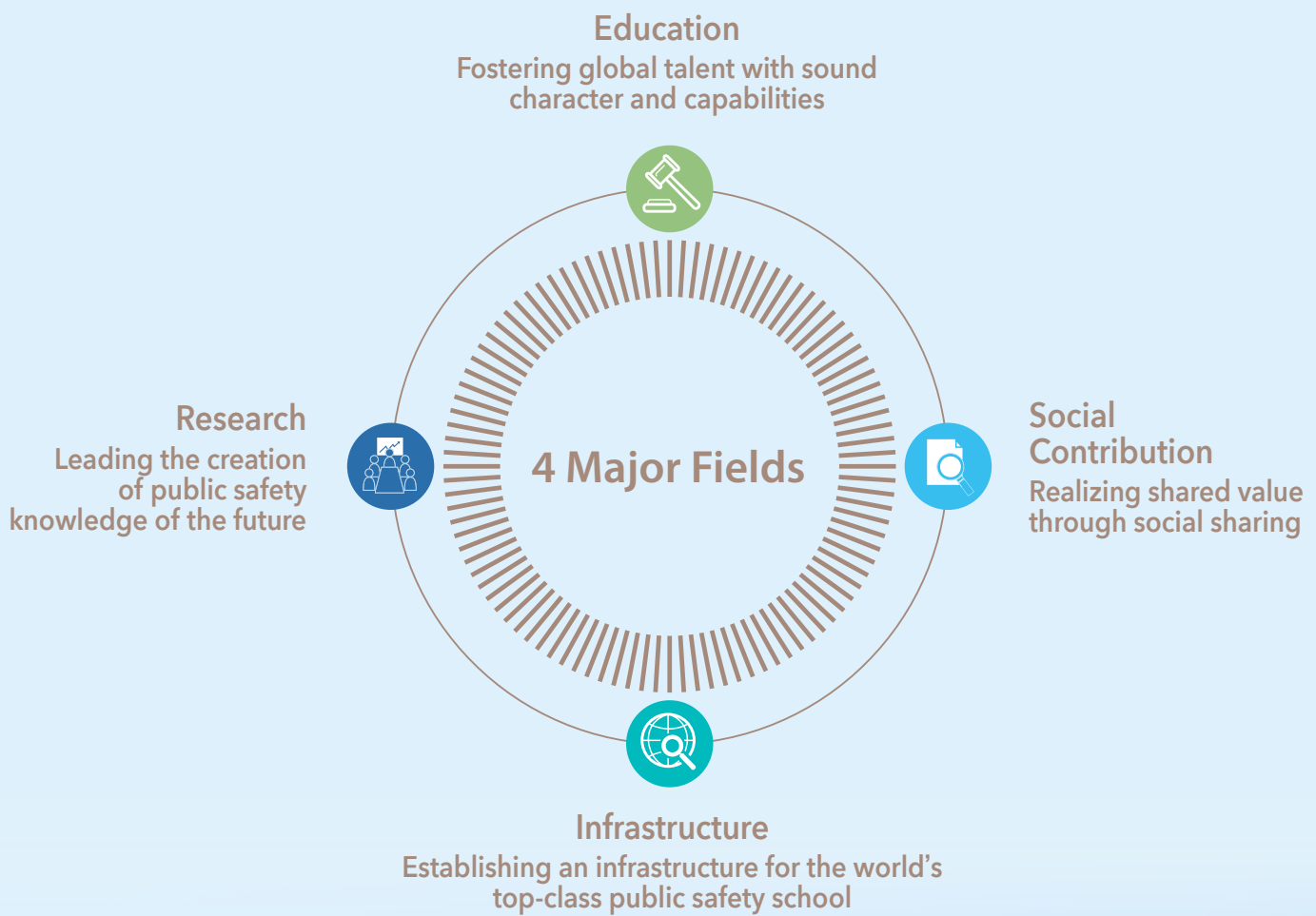

Leading Public Safety Education

The Korean National Police University has been presenting new paradigms in public safety education as the integrated educational organization operating Bachelor's program and professional education for intermediate police managers.

“The newly established Graduate School of Police Studies leads the creation of Future Public Safety Knowledge.”

Since the enactment of the 「KNPU Establishment Act」 in 1979, the university has been fostering police talent with humanistic knowledge and specialized public safety skills, and with the relocation to Asan in 2016, the university continues to excel as the “central university in police academic development.”



Bachelor's Program

Since its 1st admission in 1981, young talent dreaming of becoming police officers enter the university every year, and a total of 3,940 global public safety talent has obtained degrees to serve the public and contribute to the national development of Korea.



Job Training

Customized job trainings reflecting characteristics of each field are provided to promote leadership and field management capabilities of intermediate police managers.

Mecca of Public Safety Academic Research

KNPU is the mecca of public safety academic research developing and spreading theories related to public safety, application research and comprehensive public safety work.



Police Science Institute

It is Korea's only comprehensive public safety research center established in 1980, and it endeavors in researching fundamental problem solving that corresponds to the field and public demand of the 4th Industrial Revolution through preparing future-oriented research foundation, contributing in public safety policy decision making and converging science technology.

International Police Training Research Center

To engage in educational collaboration with overseas law enforcement agencies and to protect overseas citizens, KNPU established the International Police Training Research Center in 2016, and it is currently leading official development assistance (ODA) in public safety in collaboration with the National Police Agency and Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA).

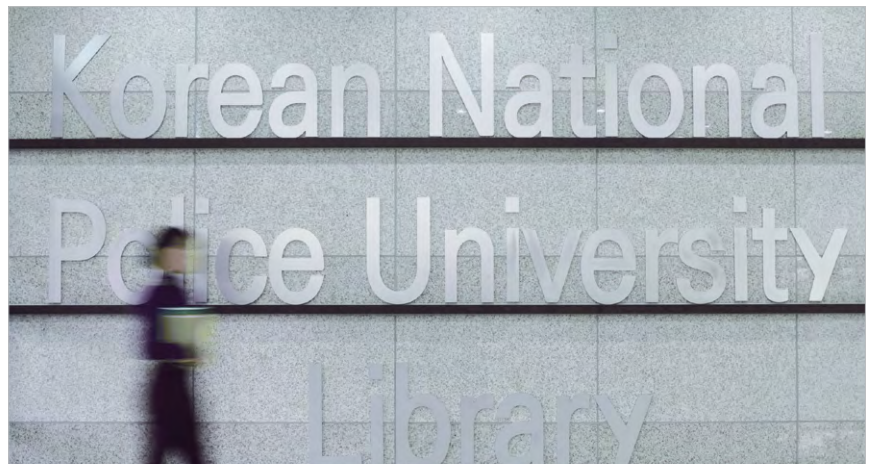

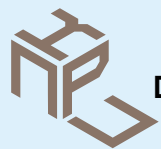

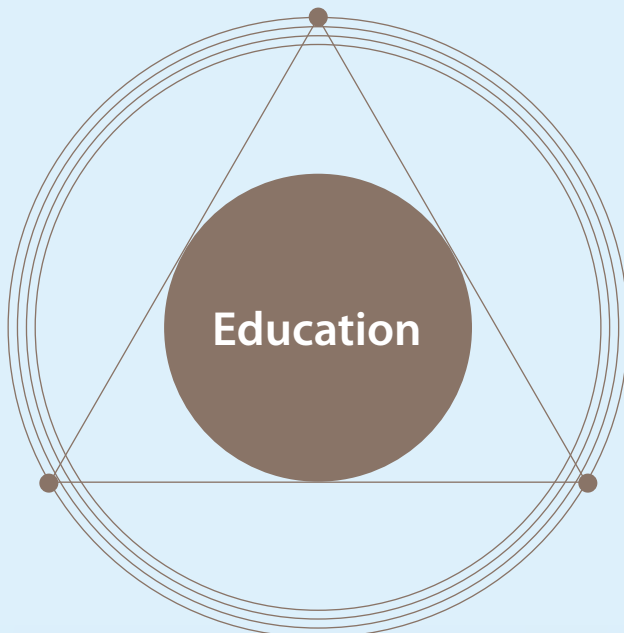

Graduation Requirement

Students who undertake required years* of studies for each degree and achieve passing grades** with foreign language test, comprehensive test and thesis grades above passing grade, and who submits final approved thesis within set period.

* Master's degree = 2 years, PhD = 3 years (studies of 4 semesters and thesis submission of 2 semesters)

** Day Time Master's Program 39 credits, Night Time Master's Program 24 credits (6 credits added if failing to submit thesis), PhD Program 39 credits

INTRODUCTION

Crime investigation is composed of various practical sub-fields including investigation related laws, investigation policies, specialized investigation according to crime type, advanced investigation methods, forensics, cybercrime investigation and investigational psychology, and it is also linked to criminal law, fact-finding, forensic science, law interpretation, psychology and criminal study. Forensics provides education with an aim to perform practical research for the scientification of investigations and promotion of expertise while pursuing advanced law principles of observing due process of human rights, fairness, expertise and efficiency. In order to achieve such, forensics operate investigation law studies and crime investigation studies.

1. Investigation Law Studies

Provides education and research for pursuing advanced investigation law principles of observing due process of human rights, fairness, expertise and efficiency based on investigation laws, investigation policies, investigation administration, investigation procedures, criminal evidence rule, comparative investigation system, investigation verdict, special crime law, corporate regulation law, cyber law and international investigation collaboration.

2. Crime Investigation

Implements practical research and education for realizing the scientification and specialization of crime investigation based on special investigation, investigation seminar, forensic investigation, profiling, cybercrime investigation, unsolved case analysis, advanced investigation criminal psychology, forensic science and investigation ethics.

INTRODUCTION

Criminology is the key field in promoting the ability to identify the cause of crimes and presenting political solutions through theoretical understanding and methodological analysis of crime, and it undertakes a key role in comprehensively understanding and analyzing various social phenomenon through collaborating and converging with various social study fields including sociology, psychology, education and ecology. Criminology aims to provide basic theoretical and methodological training to promote the academic capabilities of students as criminal experts, and through allocating equal emphasis on policy, insight and administration, it provides training to promote skills necessary to undertake public safety administration with an understanding of practical theories. In order to achieve such, criminology operates criminal analysis studies and crime prevention studies.

1. Criminal Analysis Studies

Criminal analysis studies aim to strengthen the ability to present qualitative and quantitative solutions for crimes identified in personal, organizational and social levels. Through learning skills to comprehensively utilize various theories and analyzing criminal materials collected, theoretical and practical studies form balance in research and education.

2. Crime Prevention Studies

Specialized investigation, investigation case seminar and crime prevention aim to research and study theoretical and practical methods of reducing damage or preventing criminal activities by recognizing and evaluating situations. In order to reduce or prevent criminal activities before it occurs, it studies and studies strategies and techniques which utilize various resources including the government, private organization and local communities in academic and practical perspectives.

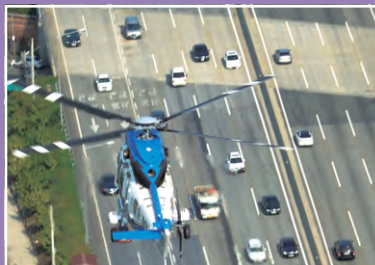

INTRODUCTION

Public Safety aims to foster administrative leaders capable of researching policies, law and safety management methods in order to establish public safety against various accidents, disorder and crisis, and capable of applying findings from such researches. In other words, strategic administrative leaders with a vision capable of efficiently leading public safety management organizations in the world of democracy, globalization, unstable socioeconomic circumstances with problem solving capabilities fostered through studying of preemptive prevention and efficient response to various accidents and incidents. In order to achieve such, Public Safety offers Public Safety Law and Public Safety Administration.

1. Public Safety Law

Public Safety Law aims to foster specialists with theoretical and practical capabilities in public safety related laws including police law, Act on the Performance of Duties by Police Officers, the Law on Assembly and Demonstration. Public Safety Law utilizes specialized courses to establish theoretical foundation of public safety studies, and it provides theoretical and practical law studies based on discussions and research of actual verdicts in order to balance administrative knowledge with practical experience.

General studies of police law, Act on the Performance of Duties by Police Officers, Law on Assembly and Demonstration, police activities and relief of rights, police verdict research, public safety information and human rights, Public Information Act, police force theory, civil and criminal laws III, civil and criminal laws IV, civil conflict and police activities I, civil conflict and police activities II, scientific technology and human rights, Human Rights Act, police comparison method, German police law analysis

2. Public Safety Administration

Public Safety Administration aims to systematically analyze various causes and components of the society that threatens public safety through various studies useful for safety experts, and provides studies useful for leaders who can develop visions and policies necessary to establish order and safety in the society.

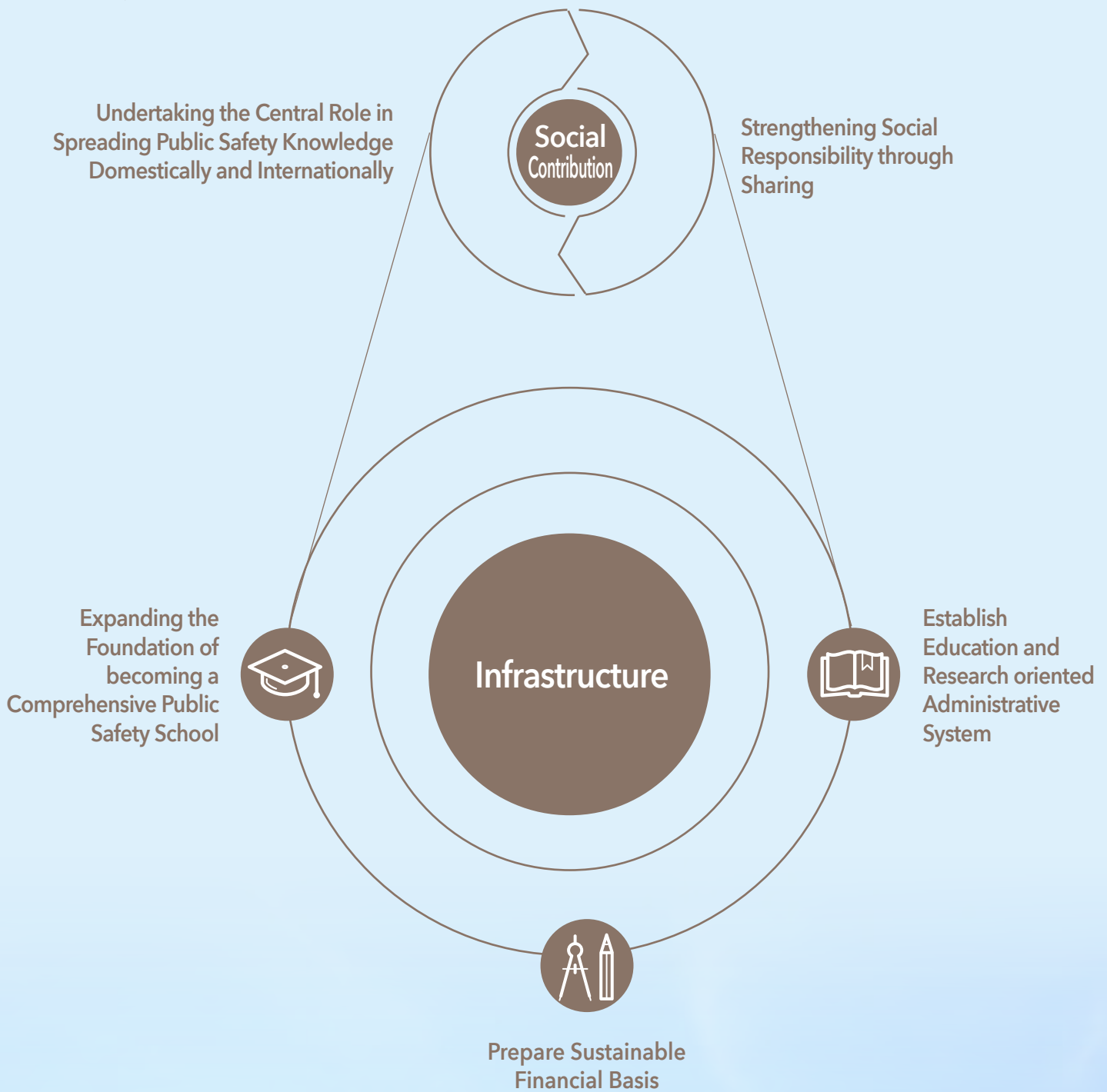

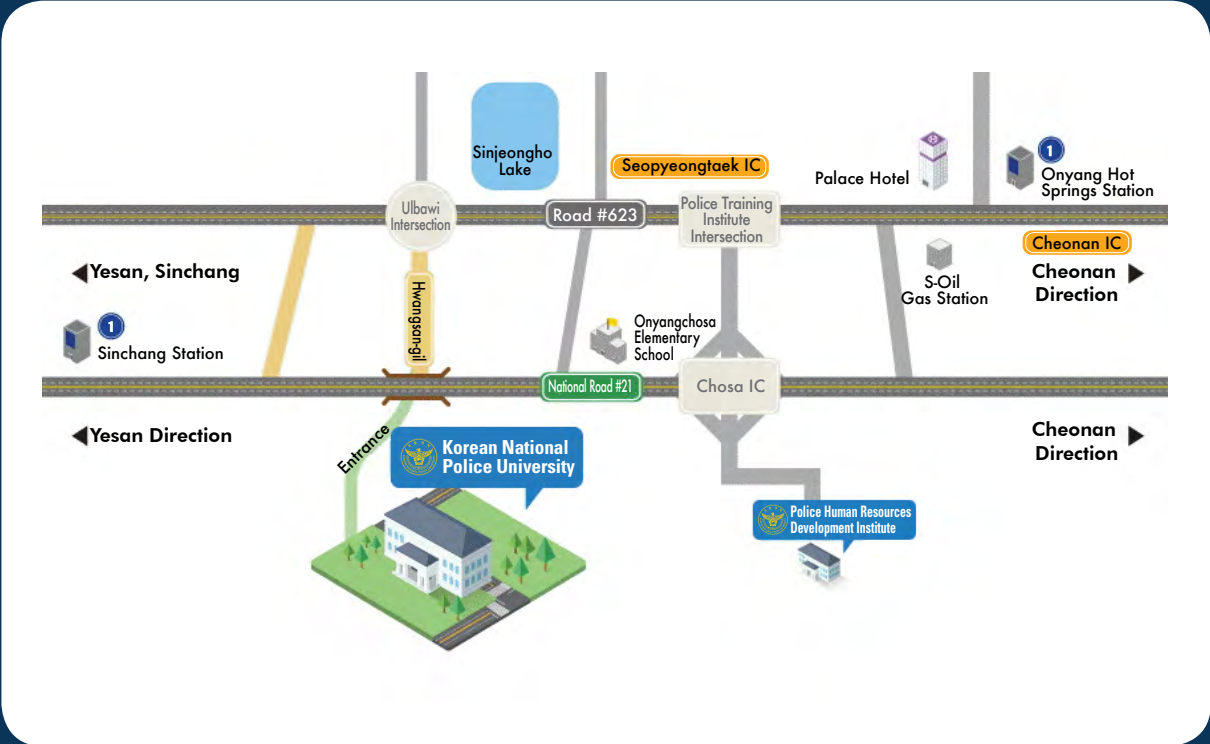
